The iVario has been developed for the preparation of hot food.

This unit may only be used commercially, such as in restaurant kitchens and large and commercial kitchens in hospitals, schools or butcheries. This unit may not be used outdoors. This unit may not be used for continuous industrial mass production of food.

All other uses are contrary to the intended purpose, and may be dangerous. RATIONAL AG assumes no liability for the consequences of using the unit contrary to the intended use.

Please note that units without a pressure cooking function have a steam nozzle. Units with pressure cooking function have 2 steam nozzles.

Units with a pressure cooking system are equipped with the locking system.

3 General safety instructions

The unit is designed to be safe and will not present any danger if used in a correct and proper way. These instructions describe how to use the unit correctly.

- Your unit must be installed by your RATIONAL Service Partner or qualified installer.
- Your unit must be maintained by your RATIONAL Service Partner.
- Do not modify the unit or the unit installation undertaken by your RATIONAL Service Partner.
- Do not use the unit if it is damaged. A damaged unit is not safe and can cause damage or fire.
- Do not place any objects on the unit.
- Do not stand on the protruding parts of the stand.
- Do not climb onto the unit.
- Do not store any flammable or combustible substances near the unit.
- Only use the unit at an ambient temperature of +10 °C to +40 °C.

Safety instructions before use

- Make sure the unit is at a temperature of at least + 5°C.
- If the unit is used again after a long period of downtime, rinse the hand shower and the automatic water refill with at least 10 litres of water.

Safety instructions during use

- Do not exceed the minimum and maximum fill levels [▶ 16] in the pan.
- Do not exceed the minimum and maximum permissible load sizes [▶ 17] for the pan. The maximum permissible load sizes vary depending on the food and cooking process.
- This will prevent material damage, injury or fatal accidents:
 - Immediately clean up any food product that has spilled onto the floor when tilting the pan. The floor must be dry to prevent injuries from slipping.
 - Carefully close the pan lid and make sure that you do not crush your fingers or those of other persons.
 - Carefully lower the pan and make sure there are no people or objects within the pan's swivel range as it moves.
- This will prevent scalding and burns:
 - Wear personal protective equipment when you are boiling, frying or deepfrying food products.
 - Wear personal protective equipment if you are removing accessories or objects from the hot pan.
 - Open the pan lid carefully during use. Hot steam may escape.

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- Do not fill the preheated pan with cold water.
- Tilt the pan slowly and carefully when full. Jerky movements may cause hot food to spill out.
- Only touch the unit on the control panel and the handle on the pan lid when in operation. The outer surfaces can reach temperatures of over 60°C.
- This will prevent fire hazards:
 - Never pour water into hot oil or fat.

Safety instructions after use

- Clean the unit after every use.
- To prevent corrosion in the pan, leave the pan lid and pan drain valve slightly open if the unit is going to be idle for a prolonged period and overnight.
- For long stoppages, shut off the power and water supplies to the unit.

3.1 Personal protective equipment

- When working with the unit, only wear clothing that cannot cause a work accident, particularly due to heat, splashing hot liquids or corrosive substances.
- Wear protective gloves for reliable protection when handling hot objects and sharp-edged trays.
- Wear tight-fitting protective glasses and chemical-safe protective gloves when cleaning to ensure reliable protection when handling care products.

4 How to work with the unit

4.1 Initial start-up

When starting up your unit for the first time, it has already been properly installed by a RATIONAL Service Partner. The unit is therefore ready for operation. You can find all the information on installation in the installation manual enclosed.


4.2 Switching the unit on and off



- 1. To switch on the unit, press and hold the button until the LED lights green: (1)
- > The unit will start. The start screen [▶ 14] will appear.
- 2. To switch off the unit, press and hold the button until the LED turns orange: (1)
- > You will be asked whether you really want to switch off the unit.
- 3. Press the button Yes
- >> The unit will be switched off.

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4.3 Start screen



- iZoneControl [▶ 47]
- Intelligent cooking iCookingSuite [▶ 24]
- Home

If you press this button, you will be navigated to the start screen.

- Manual operating modes [▶ 37]
- Favourite

When you press this button, the 10 most frequently used intelligent cooking processes will be displayed.

Intelligent modes

If you press one of these buttons, all intelligent cooking processes categorised as intelligent modes will be displayed.

Cooking methods

If you press this button, all intelligent cooking paths attributed to this mode will be displayed.

- Height adjustment [▶ 23] (optional)
- Search assistant [▶ 81]
- Date, time, status [▶ 15]
- Settings [▶ 61]
- Help [▶ 81]
- Back / Abort

If you press this button, you will return to the previous screen. If you press and hold this button, you will abort a cooking process.

4.3.1 Favourite

You can save intelligent cooking paths and programs you use often as favourites and call them up from the home screen. This can give you fast access to the dishes on a seasonal menu, for example.







- 1. In the iCookingSuite or in the programming mode, select the cooking paths or programs you would like to save as favourites.
- 3. Press the button 🔶
- >> All cooking paths and programs saved as favourites are displayed.

4.3.2 Date, time, status

In the footer, you can see the current date and time at all times, as well as the status of the following ports and connections:



USB flash drive connected

This symbol shows that you have connected a USB flash drive to the unit.



Network connection

This symbol shows that your unit is connected to a LAN network. If there is a network error, the following symbol will be displayed: 🖟



Wireless connection (optional)

This symbol shows that your unit is connected to the WLAN network. The connection quality is very good.

If the connection quality decreases, the following symbols are displayed:



If there is a connection error, the following symbol is displayed: 🎊



Error report

This symbol shows that an error message is displayed on the display.



ConnectedCooking connection

This symbol shows that your unit is connected to ConnectedCooking. If your unit is not connected to ConnectedCooking, the following symbol will be displayed: $\sqrt{}$

4.4 Interacting with the unit

NOTICE

Incorrect operation of the display

The display could be damaged if you operate it with a sharp object.


1. Only operate the unit with your fingers.

4.4.1 Moves

You can operate your unit with a few simple moves.









Scroll Drag-and-drop

4.4.2 Central dial



Instead of using these moves, you can modify settings by turning the central dial. You can pause actions such as opening the pan lid automatically, automatically lowering the pan or the integrated water filling function using the central dial. You can also switch off the signal sound which sounds for prompts using the central dial.

4.5 Fill levels

NOTICE

Damage to the unit from not adhering to maximum or minimum fill levels

If you fill the pan with too much or too little food and liquid, therefore not adhering to minimum and maximum fill levels, you may damage the unit.

1. Only fill the pan with as much food and liquid so as to meet the minimum and maximum fill levels stated here.

4.5.1 Pressure cooking fill levels (optional)

If you wish to pressure cook the food, the pan must always contain the quantity of water stated in the min. fill level / pan [I] column. The value stated in the max. fill level / pan [I] column relates to the fill level in the pan with water, liquid food or solid food in cooking liquid.

4.6 Maximum load sizes

4.7 Opening and closing the pan lid

<u>A</u> CAUTION

The pan lid can be opened and closed only with jerky movements

If the pan lid mechanism is defective, there is a risk of injury.

- 1. Open the pan lid fully and leave open.
- 2. Contact your RATIONAL Service Partner.

Open pan lid

1. Press and hold the button: <a>

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- > **ACAUTION!** Scalding hazard! If the unit is in operation, hot steam may surge out of the pan. As long as you keep the button pressed, the pan lid is automatically opened. When you release the button, the opening of the pan lid stops.
- > The button will be displayed: 📇 If you press this button, the pan lid is automatically opened.
- > The button starts to flash: 📇 If you press this button, the opening of the pan lid is stopped.

Closing pan lid

- ✓ The pan is lowered [▶ 19].
- 1. Press and hold the button:
- > The pan lid is closed automatically.

4.8 Filling the pan using the automatic water filling function


CAUTION

Germ formation in the automatic water filling mechanism

If you do not use the automatic water filling function daily, germs may form in the water line.

- 1. Clean the automatic water filling mechanism with detergent and a sponge every morning and night.
- 2. Rinse the automatic water filling mechanism with 3 litres of water every morning and night.

You can fill the pan with water automatically and exactly to the litre using the automatic water refill.



- 1. Press the button 👌
- 2. Set the desired water quantity. Observe the maximum fill volumes. Your setting will be applied automatically after just a few seconds.
- > The unit will be filled with the set water quantity. The water quantity still to be filled will be displayed.
- > The button starts to flash: **ToP If you press this button or the central dial, the automatic water refill will stop.

4.9 Tilting and lowering pan

Tilting pan

WARNING

Hot food may overflow if the pan is tilted

You could burn yourself if you touch hot overflowing food.

- 1. Wear personal protective equipment to prevent burns and scalding.
- 2. Tilt the pan carefully.
- 3. Remove any spilled food/liquid to keep the surrounding floor dry and non-slip.

WARNING

Hot food may overflow if filled in containers that are too small

You may scald yourself if you touch hot overflowing food.

- 1. Always use sufficiently large containers to fill with hot food.
- 2. Wear personal protective equipment to prevent burns and scalding.
- 3. Remove any spilled food/liquid to keep the surrounding floor dry and non-slip.
- ✓ The pan lid is fully open.
- ✓ There are no baskets hanging on the lifting arm.
- 1. Press and hold the button: \\\
- > If you release the button, the pan will stop tilting.

Lowering pan

MARNING

Risk of crushing when lowering the pan

There is a risk of crushing if you are lowering the pan and there are persons or objectives within the pan's swivel range.

- 1. Do not place any objects within the pan's swivel range.
- 2. Make sure there is nobody standing within the pan's swivel range.
- 1. Press and hold the button: 🛶
- > If you release the button, the pan will stop lowering.
- > The button will be displayed: "If you press this button or the central dial, the pan will be automatically lowered.
- > The button starts to flash: 🐃 If you press this button or the central dial again, the pan will stop lowering.
- > Shortly before the pan is fully lowered, the process will stop automatically. This is for your safety.
- 2. Press the button again: 🛶
- > The pan will be lowered fully.

You can only start manual modes and intelligent cooking processes once the pan is fully lowered.

4.10 Opening and closing the pan drain valve

You cannot open the pan drain valve in the following cases:

- You are deep-frying or have deep-fried food and did not fully tilt the pan afterwards.
- The pan is too hot.

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- 1. To open the pan drain valve, press and hold the button:
- > The pan drain valve will open.
- 2. To close the pan drain valve, press the button:
- > The pan drain valve will close.
- > The button will be displayed: ____

If the pan drain valve is opened and you call up a manual mode or an intelligent cooking process, the pan drain valve will close automatically.

Units with pressure cooking (optional)

You cannot open the pan drain valve in the following cases:

- You are deep-frying or have deep-fried food and did not fully tilt the pan afterwards.
- The pan is too hot.
- 1. To open the pan drain valve, press and hold the button: \
- > The pan drain valve will open.
- 2. To close the pan drain valve, press the button:
- > The pan drain valve will close.
- > The button will be displayed: 🔼

If the pan drain valve is opened and you call up a manual mode or an intelligent cooking process, the pan drain valve will close automatically.

4.11 Inserting core temperature probe

CAUTION

Hot core probe

There is a risk of burns if you touch the hot core probe without protective gloves.

1. Always wear protective gloves when working with the hot core probe.

<u>A</u> CAUTION

Sharp core probe

You could injure yourself with the tip of the core probe if you do not work carefully with it.

- 1. Always wear protective gloves when working with the hot core probe.
- 2. After use, attach the core probe to the pan lid at the intended position.


NOTICE


The core probe is hanging out the pan

If you do not attach the core probe to the magnetic holder after use, the core probe may be damaged.

1. After use, attach the core probe to the magnetic holder.

Meat, e.g. steak





1. Insert the core probe up to the handle into the thickest point of the food.


Small food item, e.g. goulash






1. Insert the core probe into as many pieces of food until the core probe is full with food from the tip to the handle.


Fish fillets






1. Insert the core probe up to the handle into the thickest point of the food.


Whole fish






Insert the core probe up to the handle into the thickest point of the food.
 Make sure that the tip of the core probe does not protrude into the abdominal cavity of the fish.


Vegetables, e.g. potatoes






1. Insert the core probe up to the handle into the thickest point of the food.

Soups, sauces and desserts





- 1. Place the core probe in the pan so that the core probe is completely covered with liquid.
- 2. If you stir the liquid, leave the core probe in the pan.
- 3. When you close the pan lid, make sure that the core probe is completely covered with liquid.

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Food of different sizes

- 1. First insert the core probe into the smallest piece of the food.
- 2. Once the desired core temperature has been reached, remove the small pieces of food from the core probe and from the pan.
- 3. Then insert the core probe into a larger piece of the food and continue the cooking process with the **Move** approximately option.


Core temperature probe not recognised

- ✓ The symbol will be displayed:

 ✓
- 1. Place the core probe as described in the manual into the product.
- 2. Confirm the correction.
- >> The cooking process is not performed correctly. If you do not confirm the correction, the cooking process will be aborted and you will have to start again. Some cooking paths, such as **low temperature boiling**, will continue despite the error.

4.12 Using the hand shower

The hand shower has two adjustable spray patterns, spray Ψ (A) and jet Ψ (B).



WARNING

Water vaporises explosively if poured in hot fat or oil

There is a risk of explosion if you extinguish smoking fat or oil with water.

- 1. Never pour water into hot oil or fat.
- 2. In the event of fire, close the pan lid. This will remove the oxygen from the fire. Turn off the unit. If the fire has spread, use a fire extinguisher that is suitable to extinguish a fire. Never use a water or foam extinguisher to extinguish the fire.

! CAUTION

The hand shower and the water coming out of the hand shower can reach over 60 °C

You could burn yourself if you touch hot components or come in contact with hot water.

1. Wear protective gloves while working with the hand shower.

CAUTION

Germ formation in the water pipe

If you do not use the hand shower daily, germs may form in the water line.

1. Rinse the hand shower through with water in the morning and in the evening for 10 seconds.

NOTICE

Improper handling of the hand shower

If you pull the hand shower out beyond the maximum hose length or rip the hose, the automatic retraction system of the hand shower may be damaged. Then hand shower will no longer automatically retract into the housing.

- 1. Do not pull the hand shower beyond the maximum hose length.
- 1. Pull the hand shower at least 20 cm out of the parked position.
- 2. Hold the hand shower hose firmly.
- 3. Turn the front part of the hand shower to select the desired spray pattern.
- Set the hand shower to | to select the **jet** spray pattern.
- Set the hand shower to \mathbb{W} to select the **spray** pattern.

If you do not turn the front part of the hand shower to one of the two spray patterns, water can drip from the shower head.

- 1. Press the lever on the hand shower. The harder you press the lever, the stronger the water stream will be.
- 2. After use, let the hand shower slowly retract into the housing. **ACAUTION!** Make sure that the hose of the hand shower is clean before letting it retract into the housing.

4.13 Adjusting the unit height (optional)

If your unit has the height adjustment option, you can set the height of the unit on the display. This enables you to improve the ergonomics of your workplace.

NOTICE

Objects have been placed under the height-adjustable stand or under the unit with height-adjustable feet

If there are objects underneath the height-adjustable stand or the unit with height-adjustable feet and you set the unit height, the stand and the unit could be damaged.

1. Do not place objects under the height-adjustable stand or under the unit with height-adjustable feet.


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5 Intelligent cooking - iCookingSuite



The iCookingSuite is the cooking intelligence in the iVario. You select which food is to be cooked with which cooking method. With this selection, a wide range of cooking processes will be offered so you can achieve the ideal cooking result. If required, you can use cooking parameters to adjust the cooking result to your requirements, e.g. intensifying browning or changing the cooking level from rare to well done.

While the cooking process is running, cooking parameters such as the cooking temperature are regularly adjusted so that your desired cooking result is achieved. If required, you can intervene in the cooking process even during cooking and change the cooking result. For you this means it is easy to use, no checking, no monitoring. You therefore gain time, save raw materials and energy and always have outstanding, standardised food quality.



5.1 Operating modes and cooking methods

The following modes are available:

- Cooking **
- Frying
- Deep-fry
- Braise
- Pressure cooking (optional)
- Finishing

The following cooking methods are available:

- Meat
- Vegetables and side dishes

- Soups and sauces
- Egg dishes
- Dairy foods and desserts

A specific set of intelligent cooking paths is assigned to each operating mode.

5.2 Intelligent cooking processes

5.2.1 Meat

Fry natural + breaded

Select this cooking process if you want to pan fry meat pieces.

Steam

Select this cooking process if you want to steam meat pieces.

Deep-fry

Select this cooking process if you want to deep-fry meat pieces.

Boiling

Select this cooking process if you want to boil large pieces of meat.

Boil meat under pressure

Select this cooking path if you would like to boil meat under pressure.

Confit

Select this cooking process if you want to confit meat pieces.

Casserole / Stir fried

Select this cooking process if you want to cook casseroles or stir fries.

Casserole under pressure

Select this cooking path if you want to cook casseroles or under pressure.

Braise

Select this cooking process if you want to braise larger pieces of meat.

Braise meat under pressure

Select this cooking path if you want to braise larger pieces of meat under pressure.

Sous-vide

Select this cooking process if you want to cook meat pieces sous-vide. The cooking process is ideal for portioned food.

Low temperature cooking

Select this cooking process, if you want to boil large meat pieces, which are typically cooked in liquid, overnight, or if you are not staying in the kitchen.

Low temperature casserole

Select this cooking process, if you want to cook casseroles or stir fries overnight, or if you are not staying in the kitchen.

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Low temperature braising

Select this cooking process, if you want to braise meat pieces, which are typically cooked in sauce, overnight, or if you are not staying in the kitchen. The recommended core temperature in the **low temperature braising** cooking path is lower than in the braise cooking path.

Boil sausages

Select this cooking process if you want to boil sausages.

5.2.2 Fish

Steam

Select this cooking process if you want to steam fish or seafood.

Fry fish

Select this cooking process if you want to fry fish.

Poach fish

Select this cooking process if you want to gently cook fish fillets or whole fish in stock.

Braise fish

Select this cooking process if you want to braise fish or seafood.

Braise under pressure

Select this cooking process if you want to braise fish or seafood.

Deep-fry

Select this cooking process if you want to deep-fry shellfish, fish fillets or fish portions.

Confit

Select this cooking process if you want to confit fish or seafood.

Fry seafood

Select this cooking process if you want to fry seafood.

Boil seafood

Select this cooking process if you want to boil seafood.

Sous-vide

Select this cooking process if you want to cook fish, fish fillets or seafood sous-vide. The cooking process is ideal for portioned food.

5.2.3 Vegetables and side dishes

Fry

Select this cooking process if you want to fry vegetables and side dishes.

Steam

Select this cooking process if you want to steam vegetables and side dishes.

Deep-fry

Select this cooking process if you want to blanch or deep-fry vegetables and side dishes in oil.

Gyoza

Select this cooking path if you want to prepare Japanese gyoza.

Boil potatoes

Select this cooking process if you want to boil potatoes.

Boil potatoes under pressure

Select this cooking path if you want to cook potatoes under pressure.

Boiling

Select this cooking process if you want to boil or blanch vegetables or side dishes in stock or water.

Boil under pressure

Select this cooking path if you would like to boil side dishes and vegetables under pressure.

Confit

Select this cooking process if you want to confit vegetables and side dishes.

Paella

Select this cooking path if you want to cook rice dishes such as Paella.

Polenta

Select this cooking process if you want to cook polenta.

Boil rice

Select this cooking process if you want to boil rice.

Risotto

Select this cooking process if you want to cook rice dishes such as risotto or pilaf.

Braise + stew

Select this cooking process if you want to braise or stew vegetables and side dishes.

Sous-vide

Select this cooking process if you want to cook vegetables and side dishes sous-vide. The cooking process is ideal for portioned food.

Boil pasta

Select this cooking process if you want to boil fresh or dried pasta.

5.2.4 Egg dishes

Boiled eggs

Select this cooking process if you want to boil eggs.

Poached eggs

Select this cooking process if you want to poach eggs.

Kaiserschmarrn

Select this cooking process if you want to cook Kaiserschmarren.

Omelette

Select this cooking process if you want to cook omelettes.

Onsen Tamago

Select this cooking path if you would like to prepare Japanese Onsen Tamago.

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Pancakes

Select this cooking process if you want to cook pancakes or blinis.

Scrambled eggs

Select this cooking process if you want to cook scrambled eggs.

Fried eggs

Select this cooking process if you want to cook fried eggs.

Tamagoyaki

Select this cooking path if you would like to prepare Japanese Tamagoyaki.

5.2.5 Soups and sauces

Béchamel + Velouté

Select this cooking process if you want to cook bound sauces or soups with a high proportion of milk and cream.

Convenience food

Select this cooking process if you want to prepare soups and sauces from convenience products such as pastes, powders or reductions.

Stock

Select this cooking process if you want to cook poultry, game, fish or vegetable stock.

Stock under pressure

Select this cooking path if you want to prepare stock under pressure.

Clarify

Select this cooking process if you want to cook consommés.

Boil down

Select this cooking process if you want to cook sauces, stocks or to reduce wine.

Sauces

Select this cooking process if you want to cook sauces.

Sauces under pressure

Select this cooking path if you want to prepare sauces under pressure.

Soups

Select this cooking process if you want to cook creamed soups, puréed soups or veloutés.

Soups under pressure

Select this cooking path if you want to prepare soups under pressure.

5.2.6 Dairy foods and desserts

Crêpe

Select this cooking process if you want to make crêpes.

Steam

Select this cooking process if you want to steam milk and desserts.

Deep-fry

Select this cooking process if you want to fry desserts in fat.

Boiled fruits

Select this cooking process if you want to cook fruit compote from fresh or frozen fruit, marmalades, jams or chutneys.

- 1. If you wish to preserve food in jars without a basket, place the pan base rack in the pan.
- 2. The the pan with enough water to completely cover the jars.
- 3. Boil the jars for 10 minutes.
- 4. Remove the jars from the pan and let them cool.

Kaiserschmarrn

Select this cooking process if you want to cook Kaiserschmarren.

Boil milk

Select this cooking process if you want to heat milk, cocoa or tea.

Rice pudding

Select this cooking process if you want to cook rice pudding.

Roasting nuts and seeds

Select this cooking process if you want to roast nuts and seeds.

Puddings + sauces

Select this cooking path if you want to cook pudding with fresh eggs, sauces and soups with a high proportion of milk and cream or convenience products in which milk is stirred.

Melting chocolate

Select this cooking process if you want to melt chocolate or chocolate glaze.

Boil sugar

Select this cooking process if you want to cook sugar in different consistencies for further use in pâtisserie.

5.2.7 Finishing

Glaze side dishes

Select this cooking process if you want to glaze pre-prepared side dishes in butter or oil.

Meat in sauce

Select this cooking process if you want to heat up pre-prepared casseroles, braised dishes or boiled meat pieces to service temperature.

Soups and sauces

Select this cooking process if you want to heat up pre-prepared soups and sauces to service temperature.

5.3 Conditions, information and warnings

The following symbols, information and warnings may be displayed if you start a cooking process or while a cooking process is running.



Do not use the hand shower

This symbol will be displayed when you are deep-frying food in the pan.

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Tilt the pan fully

You have deep-fried food in the pan and did not raise the pan fully to drain the frying oil.

- 1. Tilt the pan fully [▶ 19].
- 2. Remove all the fat or oil.
- 3. Then lower the pan down again fully [▶ 19].



Lower pan completely

You have selected a manual mode or an intelligent cooking process and the pan is not fully lowered.

1. Lower the pan fully [▶ 19].



Open pan lid fully

You have selected a manual mode or an intelligent cooking process and the pan lid is not fully open.

1. Open the pan lid fully [▶ 17].



Close pan drain valve

You have selected a manual mode or an intelligent cooking process and the pan drain valve is open.

1. Close the pan drain valve [▶ 19].



Close pan drain valve immediately

You have deep-fried food in the pan and have opened the pan drain valve even though you have not tilted the pan fully to drain the frying oil.

- 1. Close the pan drain valve immediately [▶ 19].
- 2. Tilt the pan fully [▶ 19].
- 3. Remove all the fat or oil.
- 4. Then lower the pan down again fully [▶ 19].



Raise basket

You have selected a manual mode or an intelligent cooking process and the basket is still lowered from a previous cooking operation.

- 1. Press the button
- > The basket will be raised fully.



Pan temperature too high

You wish to fill the pan using the automatic water refill, but the function is off. The pan temperature is too high.

1. Leave the pan to cool down by itself. Do not try to cool it quickly using cold water or ice. Once the pan has cooled, you can use the automatic water filling function again.



Automatic water filling inactive

This symbol is displayed in the following cases:

- The pan lid is not fully open.
 - Open the pan lid fully [▶ 17].
- The pan is not fully lowered.
 - Lower the pan fully [▶ 19].
- You are deep-frying food.

The water inlet will only be active again once you are no longer deep-frying food and have removed all the frying oil or fat.

You did not fully tilt the pan after deep-frying food.

Tilt the pan fully [▶ 19].

5.4 Cooking food intelligently

5.4.1 Calling up intelligent cooking process

You can call up an intelligent cooking process in 3 ways:

- Via iCookingSuite
- Via the programming mode [▶ 55]
- Via the search assistant

iCookingSuite

- 1. Press the button in the menu bar: 🙄
- > In the iCookingSuite, you can call up an intelligent cooking process in 3 ways:
- Select the desired cooking mode, e.g. vegetables and side dishes.
- Select the desired cooking method, e.g. braising.
- Select the desired cooking mode and cooking method.

Once you have selected these, the corresponding intelligent cooking processes will be displayed.

Programming mode

- 1. Press the button in the menu bar:
- 2. Press the button 🙄
- > All stored intelligent cooking processes will be displayed.

Search assistant

- 1. Press the button in the menu bar: O
- 2. Enter the name of the intelligent cooking process.
- > The desired cooking path will be displayed.

5.4.2 Starting intelligent cooking process

In this section, the **Braise / stew** cooking process will be used to show how an intelligent cooking process runs. Please note that every intelligent cooking process leads to the desired result with different cooking parameters and the ideal sequence of cooking steps.





1. Press the button in the menu bar: \square

- 2. Press the button 🍣
- 3. Press the button Braise / stew

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- > The intelligent cooking process will start and the pan will be preheated to the defined temperature.
- 4. Set the desired cooking result using the cooking parameters [> 32].
- > After a short time, the display in the Cockpit [▶ 36] will switch.
- 5. Follow the prompts of the unit.
- > When the cooking time has elapsed or the core temperature has been reached, an acoustic signal will ask you to check whether the food has reached the desired result.
- 6. If the cooking result meets your requirements, take the food out of the pan.
- 7. If the cooking result does not yet meet your requirements, continue the cooking process with one of the suggested options.

5.5 Adjusting cooking result to own requirements

Depending on which intelligent cooking process you have selected, different cooking parameters and functions will be displayed. The cooking processes use standard settings for your country in order to achieve the ideal cooking results. You can adjust these cooking parameters to your requirements with simple moves [* 16] or the central dial [* 16] and select additional functions. Depending on these settings, the cooking process workflow will vary. You can monitor the sequence at any time in the Cockpit [* 36].

5.5.1 Cooking parameters



Frying level

With these cooking parameters, you can set whether you want to sear the food or not. Select any level to adjust the searing intensity to your requirements. The lower the searing level, the less the cooking losses will be. If you select **without**, the **searing** cooking step will be skipped. Select **without** if you want to gently cook through smaller already seared meat pieces.

The very high searing temperatures safely kill the bacteria on the exterior of the food. This means that food is cooked perfectly hygienically even at a lower core temperature.



Browning

With this cooking parameter, you can set how brown the surface of the food should be. Select any level to adjust the intensity of the browning to your requirements. Food that is marinated with spices, herbs or pastes that support browning will brown quicker and more intensely. In these cases, select a lower browning level.



Delta-T cooking

With this cooking parameter, food is cooked while maintaining a constant difference between the temperature of the cooking liquid and core temperature. By slowly increasing the temperature of the cooking liquid while maintaining a constant difference with the core temperature, food is cooked slowly and very gently. This minimises cooking losses. You can set a difference between 10 $^{\circ}$ C and 60 $^{\circ}$ C. You must set the desired core temperature if using Delta-T cooking .

The smaller the difference between the temperature of the cooking liquid and the core temperature, the slower and more gently the food will be cooked. The bigger the difference between the temperature of the cooking liquid and the core temperature, the faster the food will be cooked.



Type of meat

With this cooking parameter, you can set whether you are cooking white or red meat. White meat can be pork or poultry. Red meat can be beef or lamb.



Food thickness

With this cooking parameter, you can set whether the food is thin or thick. Select **thin** for food thinner than 2 cm. Select **thick** for food thicker than 2 cm.



Size of food

With this cooking parameter, you can set how large the food is.

- Select small for fillet strips or quail breasts. Select large for roast beef, whole duck or pork belly.
- Select small for sesame. Select large for almonds.

• Select small for eggs weighing less than 53 g. Select large for eggs weighing more than 64 g.



Cooking time

With this cooking parameter, you can set the time in which the food will reach the desired cooking result or the desired cooking level. In most intelligent cooking processes, you can let your unit run uninterrupted with the settings you apply. To do this, switch on continuous operation.

1. Select the level marked with Continue.

If you have set the cooking time, the core temperature cooking parameter will not be available.



Core probes

With this cooking parameter, you can set whether the food is to be cooked with or without the core probe. You can then set the desired core temperature of the food.



Core temperature

With this cooking parameter, you can set how high the core temperature or the cooking level of the food should be.

Please adhere to the applicable hygiene regulations for the relevant food in your country when setting the core temperature.



Basket

With this cooking parameter, you can set whether the food is to be cooked with or without a basket.



Temperature

With this cooking parameter, you can set the temperature to which cooking liquids or food in cooking liquids are to be heated.



Viscosity

With this cooking parameter, you can set the consistency of soups, for example. You can also decide whether you want to soak or boil rice, or if you want to make fresh pudding or a convenience product. The possible settings vary depending on the intelligent cooking process.



Chocolate variety

With this cooking parameter, you can set whether you are cooking white, milk or dark chocolate.

5.5.2 Prompts

The following prompts may be displayed during a cooking process.



Quench

You will be prompted to quench seared food with liquid.



Fill up

You will be prompted to fill up the pan with liquid.



Load

You will then be prompted to load the unit with food.



Stir in

You will be prompted to stir in an ingredient, such as soup powder, into the cooking liquid.



Core probe in food

You will be prompted to insert the core probe into the food.

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Core probe in cooking liquid

You will be prompted to place the core probe in the cooking liquid.



Fill up with oil

You will be prompted to fill the oil into the pan.



Insert pan base rack

You will be prompted to place the roasting rack into the pan.



Open pan lid

You will be prompted to open the pan lid.



Close pan lid

You will be prompted to lower the pan lid.



Stir

You will be prompted to stir the food.



Turn

You will be prompted to turn the food.



Chop

You will be prompted to chop the food.



Skip preheating

You will be prompted to confirm that you want to skip the preheating step.

- 1. To skip preheating, press the button:
- 2. To preheat, press the button: X



Fully seared

You will be prompted to confirm that you have finished searing the food.

1. To confirm the prompt, press the button: <

5.5.3 Information

During a cooking process, the cooking steps the unit is currently performing will be displayed.



Preheat

The unit will be preheated to the temperature that is set either as the standard setting in the manual modes or in the intelligent cooking processes.



Residual time

The intelligent cooking process stills needs the time displayed to finish.



Cooking process end

The end of the cooking process has been reached.

5.5.4 Options

If a cooking path is complete, you can continue with the following options.

The options are displayed under the cooking parameters and in the cockpit. The options can be displayed and hidden.



1. To display the options, press the button: +



New batch

With this option, you can load the unit with a new batch and continue the cooking process with the defined cooking parameters.



Time continued

With this option, the cooking process will continue for a certain time. If you select the option at the end of the cooking path, a window appears where you can set how long you would like the cooking path to be continued for.

- 1. Select the desired duration.
- >> Your setting will be applied automatically after just a few seconds.

If you switch from the cockpit back to the cooking parameters, the overview is greyed out. You cannot change the cooking parameters. Once the time you have set has expired, you can either unload the unit or continue the cooking path with an option.



Move

Select this option if you are cooking foods of different sizes or different foods with different cooking levels using the core probe:

- 1. When the set core temperature is reached, open the pan lid.
- 2. Insert the core probe into a larger piece of the food or the food with the higher core temperature.
- 3. Remove all smaller pieces of food from the pan.
- 4. Close the pan lid.
- 5. Press the button 🛣
- > A window appears in which you can set the core temperature.
- 6. Select the desired core temperature.
- >> Your setting will be applied automatically after just a few seconds.

Repeat this step until all the food has reached the desired core temperature.

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Hold

With this option, the temperature is held at the set value. If you select this option, the food will be held at the preset temperature or the core temperature. This prevents overcooking. To keep cooking losses as low as possible, it is recommended that the food only be left in the pan with the Hold option for a short time. In some cooking processes, such as overnight boiling, the **Hold** option is the last cooking step and is automatically started once the desired cooking result has been achieved.

- 1. To adjust the parameters of the **Maintain** option, press the button:
- 2. Adjust the parameters as required.
- >> When the end of the cooking path has been reached, the Maintain cooking step is automatically started.



Boil

With this option, the cooking liquid, a soup or sauce, is brought to the boil.

5.6 Monitor the intelligent cooking path







If you have started an intelligent cooking path, the display changes to the cockpit after a short time. All cooking steps that the intelligent cooking path processes are displayed here one after the other. The active cooking step is highlighted. The cooking steps that will take place in the future are greyed out. When the cooking step is completed, the next cooking step is automatically displayed.

5.7 Abort intelligent cooking path

You can cancel a cooking path in the following ways:

- 1. Press and hold the button: ←
- > The cooking path is cancelled. The start screen will appear.
- 2. Press the button iii
- > You will be asked if you really want to cancel the cooking path.
- 3. To confirm the action, press the button: **OK**

6 Manual cooking



With the manual modes, the iVario supports you in your personal craftmanship.

When selecting the mode, you select whether you want to boil, fry or deep-fry the food. Then you set the pan temperature and cooking time and make all the necessary decisions yourself. This gives you control to ensure the food is cooked exactly as you want it.



6.1 Conditions, information and warnings

Before you start a cooking process or while you are cooking food, the same information as in intelligent cooking processes may be displayed. Click here for more information: Conditions, information and warnings [> 29]

6.2 Adjusting cooking result to own requirements

6.2.1 Cooking parameters



Temperature

With this cooking parameter, you can set the temperature to which cooking liquids or food in cooking liquids are to be heated.



Cooking time

With this cooking parameter, you can set the time in which the food will reach the desired cooking result. If you have set the cooking time, the **core temperature** cooking parameter will not be available.

Alternatively, you can let your unit run uninterrupted with the settings you apply. To do this, select continuous operation.

1. If you want to operate your unit in continuous operation, press either on 🕙 or slide the cooking time regulator fully to the right until the following message is displayed: **Continuous operation**



Core temperature

With this cooking parameter, you can set how high the core temperature of the food should be. If you have set the core temperature, the **cooking time** cooking parameter will not be available.



PowerBoost

With this cooking parameter, you can set how strongly the water should boil. You can choose from the following 3 levels:

- Level 1: gentle simmer
- Level 2: boil

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■ Level 3: rolling boil

6.2.2 Additional functions



Preheat

With this additional function, the pan is preheated to a defined temperature.



Gentle cooking

With this additional function, the pan is heated in such a way that delicate food such as milk does not stick. When you start this function, the ideal pan temperature will be set automatically.



Delta-T cooking

With this additional function, food is cooked while maintaining a constant difference between the temperature of the cooking liquid and core temperature. By slowly increasing the temperature of the cooking liquid while maintaining a constant difference with the core temperature, food is cooked slowly and very gently. This minimises cooking losses. You can set a difference between 10 °C and 40 °C. You must set the desired core temperature when working with Delta-T cooking.

The smaller the difference between the temperature of the cooking liquid and the core temperature, the slower and more gently the food will be cooked. The bigger the difference between the temperature of the cooking liquid and the core temperature, the faster the food will be cooked.



Basket

With this additional function, you can set whether the food is to be cooked with or without a basket.

6.2.3 Prompts and information


During the cooking process, you may see the same prompts [▶ 33] and information [▶ 34] as in intelligent cooking processes.

6.3 Cooking

6.3.1 Temperature range

Minimum temperature cooking liquid	Maximum temperature cooking liquid	Default setting

6.3.2 Cooking food





- 1. Press the button in the menu bar:
- 2. Press the button
- 3. Set the temperature of the pan base.
- > The PowerBoost level 1 is automatically activated. You can change the PowerBoost level, select the **gentle cooking** function or the **Delta-T cooking** function. You can also cook the food in baskets. Click here for more information: Cooking parameters [* 37]
- > You can now decide whether you want to cook food using cooking time or core temperature. Please note that only one of the two cooking parameters can be selected. It is not possible to combine the cooking parameters.
- 4. To cook food with the cooking time, press the button:
- 5. Set the cooking time.
- 6. To cook the food with the core temperature, press the button:
- 7. Set the core temperature.
- > The unit is heating up. If you preheat the unit with the pan lid closed, the unit will only reach a temperature that is 3 °C below boiling temperature. This prevents pressurisation in the pan.
- > When the unit is preheated, you will be asked to load it.
- 8. Load the unit.
- 9. To confirm the action, press the button: <
- > If the cooking time has elapsed or the core temperature has been reached, an acoustic signal will ask you to check whether the food has reached the desired result.
- 10. If the cooking result meets your requirements, take the food out of the pan.

6.4 Frying

6.4.1 General safety instructions


- This will prevent scalding and burns:
 - Wear personal protective equipment to prevent burns and scalding.
 - Adhere to the minimum and maximum fill levels in the pan.
 - Make sure that the core temperature probe has dried before you start frying.
 - Do not fill large quantities of moist food in hot oil or fat.
- This will prevent fire hazards:
 - Never pour water into hot oil or fat.
- This will prevent material damage, injury or fatal accidents:
 - Never extinguish burning oil or fat with water.

6.4.2 Temperature range

Minimum temperature pan base	Maximum temperature pan base	Default setting
30 °C	250 °C	200 °C

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6.4.3 Frying food





- 1. Press the button in the menu bar:
- 2. Press the button
- 3. Set the temperature of the pan base.
- > You can now decide whether you want to cook food using cooking time or core temperature. Please note that only one of the two cooking parameters can be selected. It is not possible to combine the cooking parameters.
- 4. To cook food with the cooking time, press the button:
- 5. Set the cooking time.
- 6. To cook the food with the core temperature, press the button:
- 7. Set the core temperature.
- > The unit is heating up. When the unit is preheated, you will be asked to load it.
- 8. Load the unit.
- 9. To confirm the action, press the button: <
- > If the cooking time has elapsed or the core temperature has been reached, an acoustic signal will ask you to check whether the food has reached the desired result.

10. If the cooking result meets your requirements, take the food out of the pan.

6.5 Frying

6.5.1 General safety instructions

- This will prevent scalding and burns:
 - Wear personal protective equipment to prevent burns and scalding.
 - Adhere to the minimum and maximum fill levels in the pan.
 - Make sure that the pan seal is dry before you start frying.
 - Make sure that the core temperature probe is dry before you start frying.
 - Do not fill large quantities of moist food in hot oil or fat. Moist food, like for example frozen foods, favour the foaming of the oil or fat.
 - Allow hot oil or fat to cool completely before removing it from the pan.

- This will prevent fire hazards:
 - Observe the permissible fill level in the pan and do not exceed it.
 - Never pour water into hot oil or fat.
 - Remove food residue and contaminants in oil or fat on a regular basis.
 - Check the quality of the oil or fat before frying.
 - Change the oil or fat regularly. Old oil or fat is highly flammable and tends to foam over.
- This will prevent material damage, injury or fatal accidents:
 - Never extinguish burning oil or fat with water.

6.5.2 Limited functionality

For your own safety, the following functions are not available when you are cooking food:

Automatic water refill

The following symbol is displayed while you cook food:

You can only fill the pan with the automatic water filling function once you have completely lifted the pan and removed the oil or fat.

Open pan valve

The following symbol is displayed while you cook food:

You cannot open the pan valve until you have completely tilted the pan and removed the oil or fat.

6.5.3 Temperature range

Minimum temperature of oil	Maximum temperature of oil	Default setting
30 °C	180 °C	175 ℃

If you preheat oil or fat with the pan lid closed, the oil or fat is preheated to a maximum of 150 °C. Please note the following information on acrylamide in food [\ 86].

6.5.4 Filling and emptying the pan oil or fat

Use the oil cart to easily fill and empty the pan with oil or fat. Using the oil cart, you can pump oil or fat into the pan at a maximum temperature of 180 °C. After frying, you can pour the oil or fat back into the oil cart.

Filling the oil cart

- The drain opening is closed.
- 1. Open the lid of the oil cart.
- 2. Pour the desired amount of oil or fat into the oil cart. Observe the minimum and maximum permissible fill quantities of the oil cart from 15-49 L.

Melt solid fat

- ✓ There is at least 15 litres of solid fat in the oil cart.
- 1. Set the heater switch from 0 to I.
- > The fat is heated at 80 °C and becomes liquid. The pump does not work while the heater is running.
- 2. When the fat is liquid, set the heater switch from I to 0.
- > The heating is switched off. Now you can fill the pan with fat.

Filling the pan

✓ There is liquid oil or fat in the oil cart.

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- 1. Take the oil cart to the unit.
- 2. Swing the outlet pipe over the pan, so that oil or grease can safely run into the pan.
- 3. Apply the parking brakes of the oil cart.
- 4. Connect the oil cart to the mains using the power cable.
- 5. Turn on the oil cart.
- 6. Set the pump switch from 0 to I.
- > The oil cart pumps oil or fat into the pan.
- 7. When the desired amount of oil or fat is in the pan, switch the pump switch from I to 0.
- 8. Disconnect the oil cart from the power supply, release the parking brakes and take the oil cart to its storage location. WARNING! Risk of burns! When hot oil or fat is pumped into the pan, the outlet pipe becomes very hot. Only handle the oil cart by the handles.

Emptying the pan

- ✓ The drain opening is closed.
- 1. Take the oil cart to the unit at the level of the pan outlet.
- 2. Apply the parking brakes of the oil cart.
- 3. Open the lid of the oil cart and place the filter in the opening.
- 5. Tilt the pan completely until it is completely empty.
- 6. Remove the filter and clean it.
- 7. Close the lid of the oil cart.
- 8. Disconnect the oil cart from the power supply, release the parking brakes and take the oil cart to its storage location.

6.5.5 Melt solid fat

If you do not fill the pan with the oil cart [> 41], you can melt solid fat as follows:

- 1. Place the solid fat in the pan. Do not exceed the minimum and maximum fill levels [16].
- 2. Select the manual deep fry mode.
- >> The pan will automatically be preheated to the set temperature. The fat will liquify. When the fat has reached the desired temperature, you will be asked to load the pan. Click here for more information: Frying food [> 42]

6.5.6 Frying food

It is recommended you use deep frying baskets to deep fry food. The following section therefore describes deep frying using deep frying baskets.





- 1. Mount the arm for the automatic raising and lowering mechanism.
- 2. Hang the baskets.
- 3. Fill the pan with oil or fat [▶ 41].
- 4. Press the button in the menu bar:
- 5. Press the button
- 6. Press the button
- Set the temperature of the pan base. NOTICE! If the oil or fat reaches a temperature of 230 °C because of a technical problem, the unit will automatically witch off for your safety. Contact your RATIONAL Service Partner to put the unit back into operation.
- > You can now decide whether you want to cook food using cooking time or core temperature. Please note that only one of the two cooking parameters can be selected. It is not possible to combine the cooking parameters.
- 8. To cook food with the cooking time, press the button:
- 9. Set the cooking time.
- 10. To cook the food with the core temperature, press the button: ^
- 11. Set the core temperature.
- > The unit is heating up. When the unit is preheated, you will be asked to load it.
- 12. Load the unit.
- 13. To confirm the action, press the button:
- > The baskets are lowered automatically.
- 14. If you want to raise the baskets during cooking, press the button: 🦾
- > Once the set cooking time has expired or the set core temperature has been reached, the baskets will be automatically raised.
- 15. If the cooking result meets your requirements, remove the deep frying baskets.

6.6 Abort manual cooking

You can cancel the cooking in the following ways:

- 1. Press and hold the button: \leftarrow
- > The cooking path is cancelled.
- 2. Press the button $\hat{\mathbf{W}}$
- > You will be asked if you really want to cancel the process.
- 3. To confirm the action, press the button: OK

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7 Pressure cooking (optional)

A DANGER


Risk of scalding and burns when pressure cooking with alcohol

The system is designed for pressure cooking with water. If you pressure cook food in liquids whose boiling point is lower than that of water, such as alcohol, when you unlock the pan lid, the hot liquid can vaporise or spray out of the pan together with the food at high speed. This could cause severe scalding or burns.

- 1. When pressure cooking, only use water as the cooking liquid.
- 2. Always wear your personal protection equipment.

With the optional pressure cooking function, the boiling point increases under pressure, which shortens the cooking time for casseroles, braised dishes, stocks, soups and stews by up to 35%. The iVarioBoost heating system builds pressure in the pan and maintains the pressure constantly throughout the cooking operation. This protects the cell structure of the food and you achieve high-quality cooking results in no time. For you, the shorter cooking times mean more capacity and increased productivity.

The pressure cooking system works best if you cook food under pressure at least once per week. If you use the option less frequently, the pressure cooking system can become clogged and it may take longer to reduce the pressure at the end of the cooking process. In this case, RATIONAL recommends you start a cooking process with pressure and with the minimum fill volume of water once per week. This will help to maintain the pressure cooking functionality.



7.1 General safety instructions

- The steam nozzle of the pan lid can come loose when it is struck with force and can fall into the food. The steam nozzle can be served unnoticed and parts of the steam nozzle can be absorbed.
- Never cook oil, milk or thick sauces under pressure. This food contains too little water to allow it to build up pressure. The food may burn.
- This will prevent scalding and burns:
 - Wear personal protective equipment to prevent burns and scalding.
 - Adhere to the minimum and maximum fill levels in the pan.
 - Never cook food in alcohol under pressure. Alcohol has a lower boiling point than water and can boil over.

 After pressure cooking, carefully open the pan lid. Hot food can foam or splash out.

A DANGER

Risk of scalding and burns when pressure cooking with alcohol

The system is designed for pressure cooking with water. If you pressure cook food in liquids whose boiling point is lower than that of water, such as alcohol, when you unlock the pan lid, the hot liquid can vaporise or spray out of the pan together with the food at high speed. This could cause severe scalding or burns.

- 1. When pressure cooking, only use water as the cooking liquid.
- 2. Always wear your personal protection equipment.

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
8 iZoneControl



With iZoneControl you can divide the pan base into individual heating zones and operate these with different temperatures; unused surfaces can even stay cold. You specify the desired result and start the cooking process for each heating zone. The heating zone will now be heated to the optimal temperature leading to your desired result.

NOTICE

The temperature difference between the zones should not be more than 130 °C.

The functional parts must be cleaned according to the care interval, but can be cleaned more frequently if required.

13.3 Care products

Suitable care products

- Clean the unit with lukewarm water and a sponge.
- Clean the interior of the pan with diluted vinegar if there is limescale or discolouration.

Unsuitable care products

Do not clean the unit, its functional parts and accessories with the following unsuitable care products:

- Scouring cleaning agents or abrasive cloths
- Substances containing hydrochloric acid, caustic solution, sulphur or other oxygen-requiring substances
- Scouring pad sponge with scrubber
- Steel wool
- Sharp or pointed tools

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13.4 Cleaning the pan

CAUTION

If the pan base is hot, cold cleaning water can heat up quickly and spray from the pan

You may scald yourself if you touch hot spraying water.

1. Leave the pan to cool down by itself. Do not try to cool it quickly using cold water or ice.



Cleaning the interior of the pan

- 1. Clean the pan, particularly in the corners and edges.
- 2. Remove any food residues and layers of fat, starch and protein.
- 3. To remove more stubborn limescale or colouration, bring diluted vinegar to the boil.
- 4. Then drain the diluted vinegar and rinse the pan with clear water.

Cleaning the exterior of the pan

- 1. Only clean the exterior of the pan when the pan is lowered.
- 2. Clean the exterior side of the pan with a soft sponge.
- 3. When cleaning, make sure that you only pour the water into the unit from above.

Cleaning the pan lid gasket

- 1. Clean the pan lid gasket with a soft sponge.
- 2. Clean the groove between the gasket lips, in which water can accumulate.

Cleaning the core probe

1. Clean the core probe and the core probe cable with a soft sponge.

Cleaning the steam nozzles

Please note that units without a pressure cooking system have a steam nozzle. Units with a pressure cooking system have two steam nozzles.

- 1. Remove the steam nozzles by hand without using tools.
- 2. Clean the recess in the steam nozzles with the hand shower.
- 3. Clean the steam nozzles using the hand shower or in the dishwasher.
- 4. Put the steam nozzles back in place.

Cleaning the automatic water refill

1. Clean the automatic water refill with detergent and a soft sponge every morning and night.

Cleaning the pan valve

- 1. Open the pan valve.
- 2. Unscrew the pan valve.
- 3. Clean the opening, the lid and the gasket of the pan valve with a sponge.
- 4. Screw the pan valve back into place.

13.5 Cleaning the hand shower

- 1. Pull the hand shower hose out completely and hold it firmly.
- 2. Clean the hand shower and the hose with a soft sponge.
- 3. To remove stubborn scale, clean the hand shower and the hose with diluted vinegar.

13.6 Cleaning the control panel

If your unit is equipped with a lockable control panel, you have to unlock the lockable control panel and open the cover before cleaning the control panel.

Before you clean the display, you can lock it. This prevents accidentally starting cooking processes, performing actions or calling up functions.

- 1. Press and hold the button: σ°
- > After a few seconds, the display lock will be activated and the symbol displayed: 💣
- 2. Clean the display with a soft cloth.
- 3. To lock the display, press and hold the button: \overrightarrow{a}
- > The symbol will be displayed: σ^0
- 4. **A**CAUTION! Risk of cuts! The central dial has sharp edges. Wear protective gloves when cleaning the central dial and the surfaces below it. Pull off the central dial by hand and without tools.
- 5. Clean the central dial and the surface below it with a soft cloth.
- 6. Replace the central dial.

13.7 Cleaning accessories

- 1. Let the accessories cool before cleaning.
- 2. Remove any food residues and layers of fat, starch and protein with a soft cloth.
- 3. In case of stubborn dirt, soak the accessories in lukewarm water and then remove the dirt with a soft cloth.

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Cleaning the pressure cooking system



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15 Maintenance

You can perform the following maintenance work yourself:

- Replacing the pan lid gasket [▶ 84]
- Replacing the pan drain valve gasket [▶ 84]

If the network cable on your unit is defective, it may only be replaced by RATIONAL or your RATIONAL Service Partner.

15.1 General safety instructions


- Wear protective gloves to protect yourself from cuts from sharp edge on the metal housing.
- If you are using a sharp or pointed tool to replace the gasket, this may damage the unit and optimal cooking results can no longer be achieved.

15.2 Replacing the pan lid gasket



- 1. Open the pan lid.
- 2. Pull the pan lid gasket out from the groove by hand without a tool.
- 3. Clean the groove with a soft sponge.
- 4. Moisten the retaining lips of the new gasket with soapy water.
- 5. First press the corners of the gasket into the corners of the groove.
- 6. Then press the rest of the gasket into the groove.
- 7. Make sure that the new gasket sits fully in the pan lid indentation.

15.3 Replacing the pan drain valve gasket



- 1. Open the pan valve [▶ 19].
- 2. Unscrew the pan valve.
- 3. Pull the old gasket out by hand without a tool.
- 4. Clean the opening and the pan valve lid with a sponge.
- 5. Insert the new gasket.
- 6. Screw the pan valve back into place.
